They were adopted as a useful tool by various people all over the world. Everyone was happy. But then, these people wanted to send their work, stories and funny jokes to each other in the form of text. And unfortunately, these silly people never managed to agree on using one language and writing system. That's alright, but they also did not agree on using one encoding format for their text. Legacy Encodings You see, computers don't think in letters and lines, but in bits, bytes and numbers. So our humans had to come up with a way to represent text as a bunch of numbers Easy! Just map a symbol from your writing system of choice to a number that a computer can handle. For example, in the text you are reading right now, the lowercase latin alphabet, a to z, is carried by the numbers 97 to 122 inclusive. But not everyone with a computer can read latin. These guys use scripts like Cyrillic, Greek, Arabic, Han, Katanka and Kanji, and they used the same number trick to encode their text. For example, the Cyrillic letter (De) is encoded as the number 196 in the Windows-1251 encoding where in the ASCII Extended encoding it is ", a vertical line used to draw boxes. So before opening a text file sent by your friend on the other side of the world, you first have to know which encoding they used to write that file. You can guess, but there are a lot of these old encodings, almost 60! So when you open the file, it might look something like this: rc=X[s-j]@eD0["eSSQccWUN/k5.LSTtad:
