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enhance learning and engage young children in a variety of ways such as interactive games, educational videos or virtual field trips. I also ensure to balance screen time with hands-on, sensory activities to keep a well-rounded learning experience for the children. Experience with Young Children 6. How do you differentiate your teaching approach to cater to the diverse learning needs of young children? A: As every child learns differently, I make sure to incorporate a variety of teaching strategies and activities that cater to different learning styles such as visual, auditory and kinesthetic.
