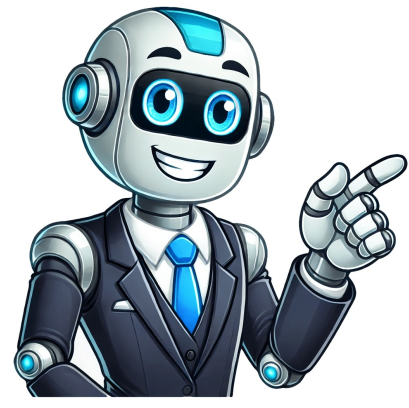

As mentioned in the chapter, while telling her life story to Himiko Toga during their confrontation to get through to her and stop her from creating further clones and destroying herself, Uraraka finally gets to the part where she admits that she fell in love with Deku, saying (via My Hero Academia): "And then I fell in love with Izuku Midoriya [aka Deku]... To further understand the concept behind the situation they were in: Since Toga had become one of the most dangerous villains in the final war, the pressure on Uraraka to rein her back in was enormous, and thus, she decided to address the very thing that connected her to Toga: their shared love for Izuku Midoriya aka Deku. They are well aware of the previous chapters where the manga not only brought forward quite some cute interactions between the pair but also teased romance between them without truly delivering in some scenes. However, the becoming canon of the fan-favorite couple wasn't the only highlight of My Hero Academia chapter #394—one other major confession from Ochako Uraraka to Himiko Toga also awaited further in the chapter. After years of build-up, fans were desperate to know if their love lives ended well for the two of them. I think it's about time for you to start thinking more highly of yourself. - Katsuki Bakugo, MHA Chapter 430 When Deku and Uraraka are finally alone, Deku is inspired by Bakugo's words from Chapter 430 and tells Uraraka that he wants to spend more time with her. Ochaco has also been thinking of this, thanks to the ghostly appearance of Toga, a character fundamental to Ochako's character arc. Toga helped Uraraka decide to follow love and what kind of hero she wants to be. Toga pushes Uraraka into Deku's arms, and the two are blushing, practically confirming their relationship status. However, some fans still hesitated to consider them a couple unless they were shown explicitly together in the manga. Despite the clear-cut answer, some fans still wondered if Deku and Ochaco were together. With no on-screen kiss or grand confession of love, they were confused about whether that meant something. In the question and answer, Horikoshi stated: Question: Did Ochaco finally confess her feelings to Deku? Horikoshi: Please read Manga Volume 42 and use your imagination to answer that question. Rather than confirm Midoriya and Ochaco's relationship outright, Horikoshi asks confused fans to re-read Volume 42 and gather the answer to that question themselves. There's no need to question it any further: Deku and Ochaco are at least open to exploring a relationship together. Despite how many people this decision made happy, it was bound to upset many fans. When the bonus chapter emerged, many fans even blocked Horikoshi due to anger, feeling his relationship was better suited for other characters. There was a lot of discussion about Uraraka being downgraded in terms of character writing to be Deku's girlfriend. However, fandom war is expected territory for anime communities. While fandom can be a safe space and a community for many of a series, it can also be a place where the loudest voices speak the cruelest and taint the global perception of them. It's important to remember that while some My Hero Academia fans expressed their disappointment, many expressed and continue to express their joy at the announcement, lovingly discussing the various reveals in the fanbook. At the end of My Hero Academia's epilogue, Izuku Midoriya and Katsuki Bakugo also ascended the hero rankings, going to Ranks No. 4 and No. 5, respectively. Deku is now known as 'One For All Hero Deku,' and alternates between being an instructor for history and hero history and being a Pro Hero. With Ochaco Uraraka's support, he continues being a hero who reaches out to everyone, and with Bakugo's rivalry, he's constantly being pushed to improve. Uraraka, on the other hand, has finally been able to send money back to her family, a testament to her growth and success as a hero. My family... was poor. And my folks were always looking kinda gloomy. I set out to become a hero to make their lives easier and cheer 'em up!! — Uraraka to Toga. For Uraraka, she started the series as a desperate student who wanted to send money to her parents. They owned a construction business that hadn't received much business in years and could not get any work. Uraraka's desire to help her family and the people she loved became the basis of her character, letting her steal the show multiple times. In a show of pride and parental responsibility, her parents never touch that money, even if they need it; the one thing they care about the most is their daughter's happiness. Related These MHA characters ended up contributing little to nothing in the series' overarching plot. The other Class 1-A Alumni are also doing well, with Tenya taking over his brother Tensei's agency, Denki helping out at power supplies during disasters, Jirou continuing her music career, and Ojiro wanting to open a dojo. Even Tsu is finding ways to be a hero by opening an agency in her hometown. As for Eri, she is also training to be a musician and is living the life that Class 1-A fought to give her. Todoroki can make kids smile with his ice Quirk, and Bakugo is constantly belittled for his attitude. The fanbook even revealed that Bakugo is likely as strong as the No. 1 Hero, Lemillion, but due to his attitude, he is constantly being knocked down in popularity. In the initial ending, there was no mention of the relationship between Uraraka and Izuku. Many fans were distraught that the series ended with the two not even talking or interacting, crying out that the build-up between the two didn't have the catharsis that it needed at the end. This was a common criticism of My Hero Academia Chapter 430, as not even characters like Bakugo, All-Might, or Shoto had final cathartic moments with any castmates. This was even more confusing, especially since many of the final chapters in the Final War Saga were teasing something relating to Deku and Uraraka, especially with how often they were growing and inspiring each other. It even started a trend that made the fanbase believe that Deku's friends only wanted to be with him when he was a hero. Thankfully, the Bonus Chapter and the Volume 42 chapter eased fans. This showcases that the characters are lifelong friends who engage with each other and push each other to live their lives. Horikoshi may showcase more about Deku and Uraraka in the future, but there's no guarantee he'll continue with more work. Release Date April 3, 2016 My Hero Academia fans often ask the question "Does Uraraka confess her feelings to Deku?" since the series seemed to have ended with chapter 430 in the manga, but the final volume added a new one, giving the story a much satisfying conclusion. The protagonist realizes he wants to be with Uraraka, who has been burdened by the death of Himiko Toga for a long time. It is worth highlighting that the two characters meet after the party and share some words, although neither directly says they want to be together as a romantic couple but that is the intention. That is because the manga emphasizes the romantic undertones of their relationship, especially because neither character would need a scene like this one if they were not going to become a couple. Furthermore, when chapter 430 came out, months before the real conclusion, there was discontent among the fandom because this plot point was never resolved. That gives this scene a lot more importance since it shows both characters sharing their feelings from a romantic perspective. While that was all well and good, what got most of the fandom's attention was the confirmation of the relationship between Deku and Ochaco Uraraka. Most readers and viewers of the series were always aware that these characters had feelings for each other. However, the original final chapter, 430, which came out months ago, was perceived as a disappointment since it didn't tackle this topic. It seemed at the time that Horikoshi wasn't brave enough to confirm or deny this relationship between Deku and Uraraka, leaving it open-ended in what was viewed as a divisive decision. However, all of that has come to rest now that this new final chapter ended with a last scene where the two characters meet on the streets and the protagonist reveals his feelings to be with her. Moreover, Uraraka was finally able to move on from her guilt after Himiko Toga's death and embraced the possibility of loving, thus ending the story with these two characters together in a relationship. More reactions online The My Hero Academia fandom has a long-standing reputation for being very passionate about shipping and fanfiction, which rose to the surface with this new turn of events. While most fans always knew that Deku and Uraraka had romantic feelings for each other, there was hope in some sections of the fandom that the protagonist wasn't going to go in that direction. Some claimed that their characters didn't benefit from having romantic feelings for each other while others were shipping Deku with a wide variety of people, the most notably being Katsuki Bakugo, to the shock of many. However, the evidence in the manga was clear and the protagonist's only real romantic endgame was always going to be Uraraka, much to the happiness of most of the community. "I KNEW MY GOAT GOT GAME LES GO," someone said. "Not the Toga ghost support. This is just Precious," another person said. "Toga is canonically an izoucha shipper," someone else said. Some critics claimed that this moment didn't solidify a relationship since they didn't do anything overly romantic or intimate. However, it is not uncommon for shonen couples to not show those things to the reader, and is also part of the course in Japanese culture, especially because the My Hero Academia author has always stated that hands are a significant symbol of union for him. "The best part about Izoucha being canon is that these people are finally dropping the act and stopping pretending to care about Ochako as a character and are showing their true colors," someone else said. In a shocking twist, Ochako may have finally confessed her feelings for Deku, but the confession wasn't presented as the scene's most important element. Not only did Ochako sandwich the long-awaited words between two other thoughts, but they aren't what enable Ochako to reach Toga on an emotional level. It's the fact that Ochako says she thinks Himiko's smile is special and cute. How other people, including Toga's parents, negatively viewed her smile was revealed to be one of the villain's most traumatic memories when the series first showed her flashback many chapters ago. All Toga ever wanted was for other people to accept her (and her smile). In fact, that was one of the main reasons why she joined the League of Villains, and now Ochako has finally given Toga what she always wanted outside the League of Villains. It's appropriate that My Hero Academia chose to place the most weight on Toga's deepest insecurities while allowing Ochako to do so herself without relying on Deku. In Chapter #429, Uraraka goes off by herself, and Deku manages to find her. It turns out that Toga's fate has really been weighing on Uraraka, and she finally breaks down about it in front of Deku. Acknowledging all that Uraraka has done for him throughout the story, Deku openly tells her that she is his hero, and that he wants to be there for her in the same way that she's been there for him. The pair commiserate about their inability to save their respective villains (Toga and Shigaraki), but soon the rest of Class 2-A shows up, and the scene ends before Uraraka can admit her feelings to him. While this scene didn't take Deku and Uraraka's relationship to the next level, those feelings are very much still there, and this was an emotional and intimate moment that the two shared (before being interrupted, anyway). It may take more time before Uraraka is willing to tell Deku about how she feels, and this simply wasn't the right moment for it to happen. Uraraka was in tears over Toga, after all, and likely wasn't in the mood to reveal her feelings.
