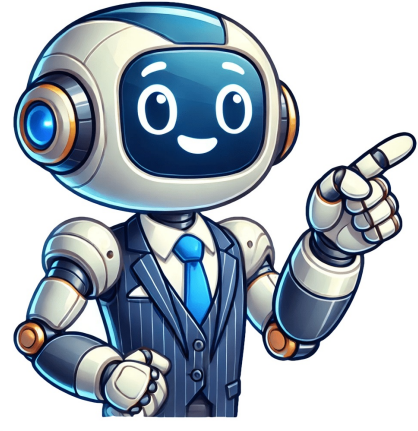

The primary purpose of the NEC is to provide strategic direction for the Party as a whole and to work in partnership with the Partys representatives in Parliament, the devolved administrations and local government to secure the Partys objectives across the country.
